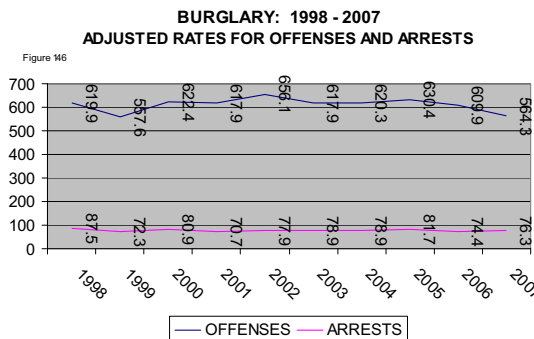
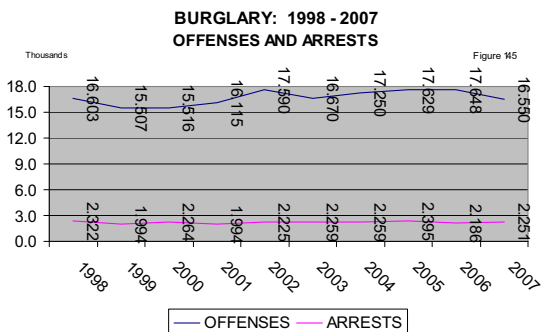


BURGLARY

Burglary offenses recorded the highest number for the decade in 2006 (17,648), but the highest rate was recorded in 2002 with 656.1 per 100,000 population. In 2007, the offense rate decreased 7.5% from 2006 recording the lowest rate (564.3) since 1999 (557.6). The highest arrest rate was recorded in 1998 with 87.5 per 100,000 population and the lowest rate was in 2001 (70.7).

There were 16,550 burglary offenses reported in 2007. Ninety-four percent or 15,607 of the offenses were reported as completed while six percent or 943 were reported as attempted. Ninety-four percent of the 2005 burglaries were also reported as completed, which was slightly higher than the ninety-three percent in 2004 and 2006. A lowest percent of completed burglaries for the five year period was recorded in 2003 with ninety-two percent. The highest number of recorded offenses was in 2006.

IOWA, 2007**

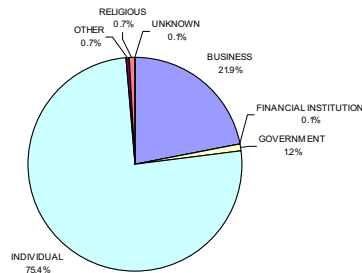

Individuals accounted for 75.4% of the burglary victims in 2007. Among individuals, 57% or 7,641 were male and 43% or 5,806 were female. Businesses recorded 21.9% of the total victims. Government (214 victims), religious organizations (119 victims), and financial institutions (12 victims) also contributed to the total number of burglary victims. There were 140 victims listed as other or unknown.

IOWA, 2007**

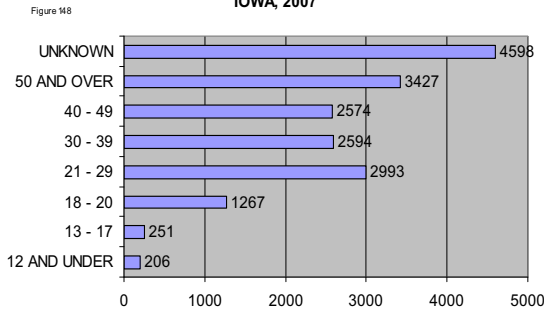

IOWA, 2007**

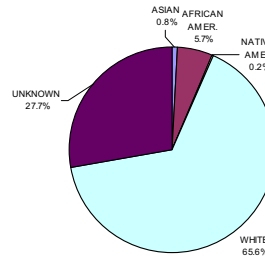

In 2007, the age group 50 and over was reported most often (26% or 3,427 victims) among individual victims. Ninety-six percent of the unknown victims (4,463) are comprised of businesses, financial institutions, religious organizations and government victims. White persons (65.6%) recorded the highest percentage of individual victims.

IOWA, 2007**

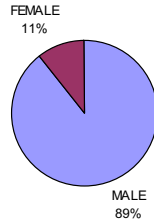
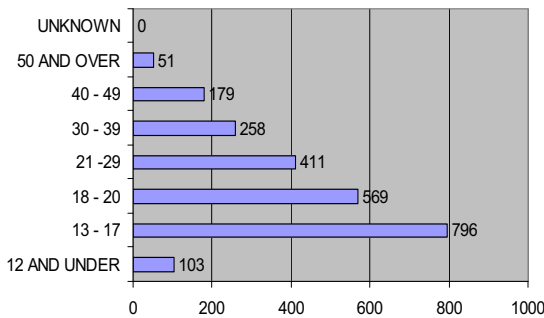

Males accounted for 89% (2,114 offenders) of the recorded arrests in 2007 while females recorded 11% (253 offenders). White males were the most arrested group of persons accounting for 69% of the total arrests followed by African American males with 19%.

IOWA, 2007**

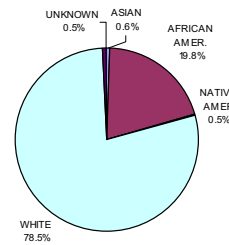


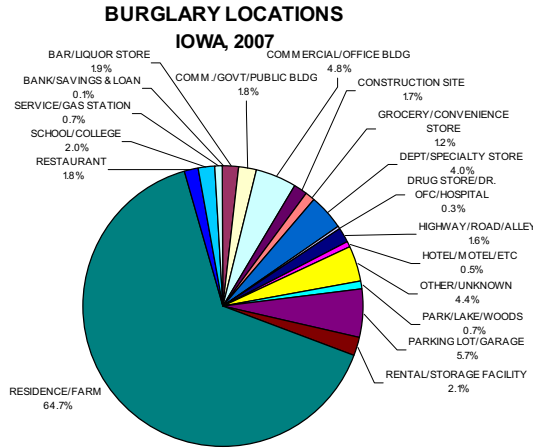

In 2007, the age group 13 - 17 (796 arrests) was the most often arrested for burglary, accounting for 33.6% of the total number of arrests followed by 18 – 20 year olds (569 arrests) with 24%. Among race, White individuals accounted for 78.5% of the arrests followed by African Americans with 19.8%.

Residence or farm was the location most reported for the occurrence of a burglary in 2007, accounting for 64.7% followed by a parking lot/garage with 5.7%. Commercial/office buildings (4.8%), other/unknown (4.4%) and department or specialty stores (4.0%) were groupings that recorded the next highest number of offenses.
