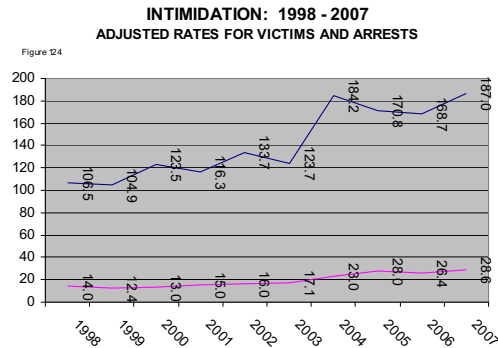
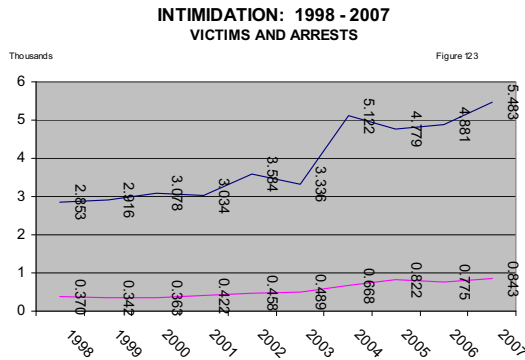


INTIMIDATION

“To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.”

Intimidation rates showed minimal change in the early part of the decade with a 16% increase from 1998 to 2003 following a series of ups and downs. However, 2004 recorded a nearly 50% rate increase, which set a record high. In 2007, 5,483 victims were reported setting a new high rate of 187.0. Arrest rates have more than doubled over the last decade with 2007 (28.6) setting a decade high.

RELATIONSHIPS

The offender was known to the victims in 71% of the incidents. “Acquaintance” recorded the highest number of known relationships accounting for 26.5% followed by the “Otherwise Known” category with 21%.

IOWA, 2007

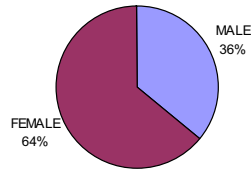
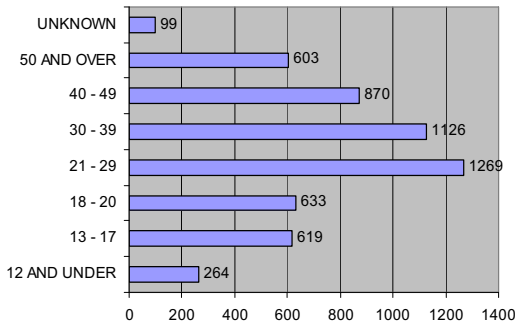

Females accounted for 64% (3,495 victims) of the intimidation victims in 2007, with males accounting for 36% (1,954 victims). White females (54% or 2,975 victims) recorded the highest percentage of victims followed by White males (30% or 1,669 victims).

IOWA, 2007

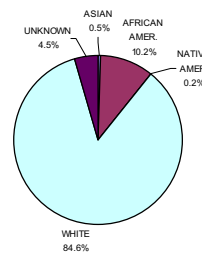

In 2007, the age group between 21 and 29 was reported most often (23% or 1,269 victims) followed by the victims age 30 to 39 (20% or 1,126 victims). Victims age 12 and under recorded the lowest percentage (5% or 264 victims). Among race, White victims (84.6%) recorded the highest percentage followed by African American victims (10.2%).

IOWA, 2007

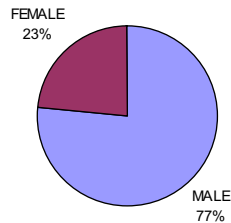
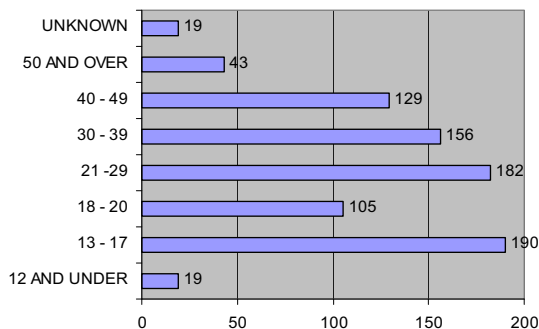

Males accounted for 77% (645 offenders) of the recorded arrests in 2007, while females recorded 23% (198 offenders). White males were the most arrested group of persons accounting for 60% of the total arrests followed by White females with 19% and African American males with 15%.

IOWA, 2007

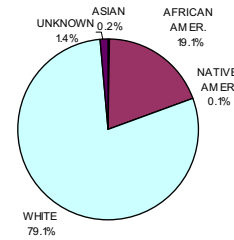

In 2007, the age group 13 to 17 (190 arrests) was the most often arrested for simple assault accounting for 22.5% the total number of arrests. The next most arrested age groups were 21 to 29 (182 arrests) and 30 to 39 (156 arrests) accounting for 21.6% and 18.5% respectively. Among race, White individuals accounted for 80% of the arrests followed by African Americans with 19%.
