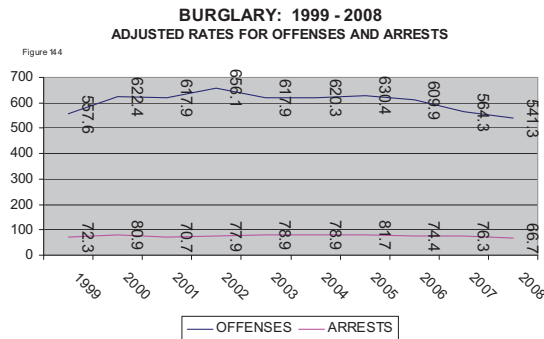
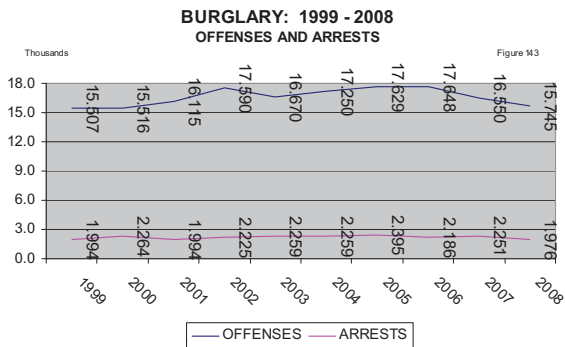

Burglary offenses recorded the highest number for the decade in 2006 (17,648), but the highest rate was recorded in 2002 with 656.1 per 100,000 population. In 2008, the adjusted rate declined for the third year in a row decreasing 4.1% from 2007 and recording a decade low. The highest arrest rate for the decade was recorded in 2005 with 81.7 arrests per 100,000 population. In 2008, the arrest rate recorded its lowest figure for the decade with 66.7 arrests per 100,000 population.

There were 15,746 burglary offenses reported in 2008. Ninety-four percent or 14,780 of the offenses were reported as completed while six percent or 966 were reported as attempted. Ninety-four percent of the burglaries in 2005 and 2007 were also reported as completed, which was slightly higher than the ninety-three percent recorded in 2004 and 2006.

IOWA, 2008

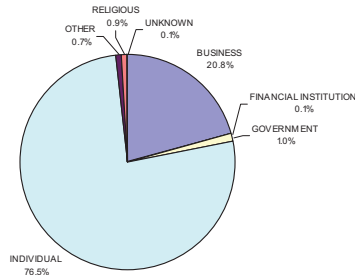

Individuals accounted for 76.5% of the burglary victims in 2008, which is a slight increase from the 75.4% represented in 2007. Among individuals, 56% or 7,242 were male and 44% or 5,520 were female. Businesses recorded 20.8% of the total victims; a decrease from 2007. Government (161 victims), religious organizations (143 victims), and financial institutions (21 victims) all increased slightly in number. There were 129 victims listed as other or unknown.

IOWA, 2008

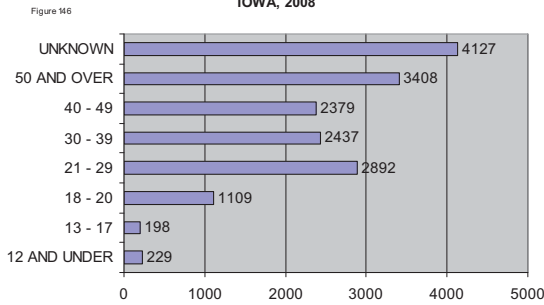

IOWA, 2008

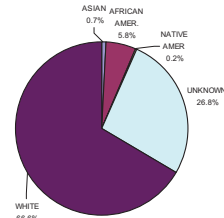

In 2007, the age group 50 and over was reported most often (26.6% or 3,408 victims) among individual victims. White persons (87.0%) recorded the highest percentage of individual victims. There were 369 reported Hispanic victims (216 male, 153 female). Ninety-nine percent of the unknown victims (3,949) are comprised of businesses, financial institutions, religious organizations and government victims.

IOWA, 2008

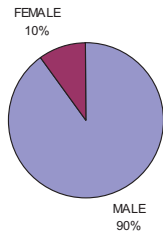
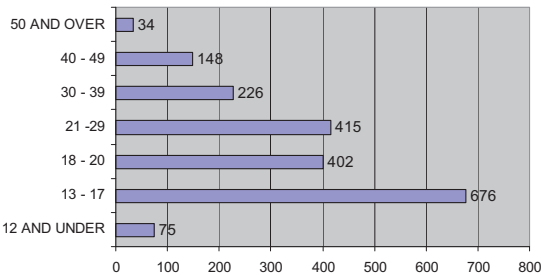

Males accounted for 90% (1,778 offenders) of the recorded arrests in 2008 while females recorded 10% (198 offenders). White males were the most arrested group of persons accounting for 70.5% of the total arrests followed by African American males with 17.9%.

IOWA, 2008

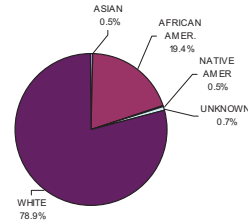


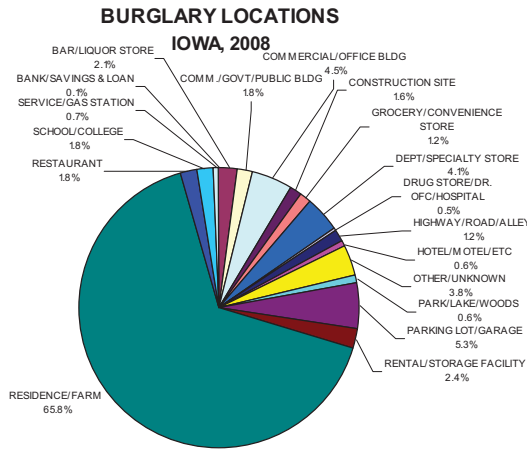

In 2008, the age group 13 - 17 (676 arrests) was the most often arrested for burglary, accounting for 34.2% of the total number of arrests followed by 21-29 year olds (415 arrests) with 21.0%. Among race, White individuals accounted for 78.9% of the arrests followed by African Americans with 19.4%.

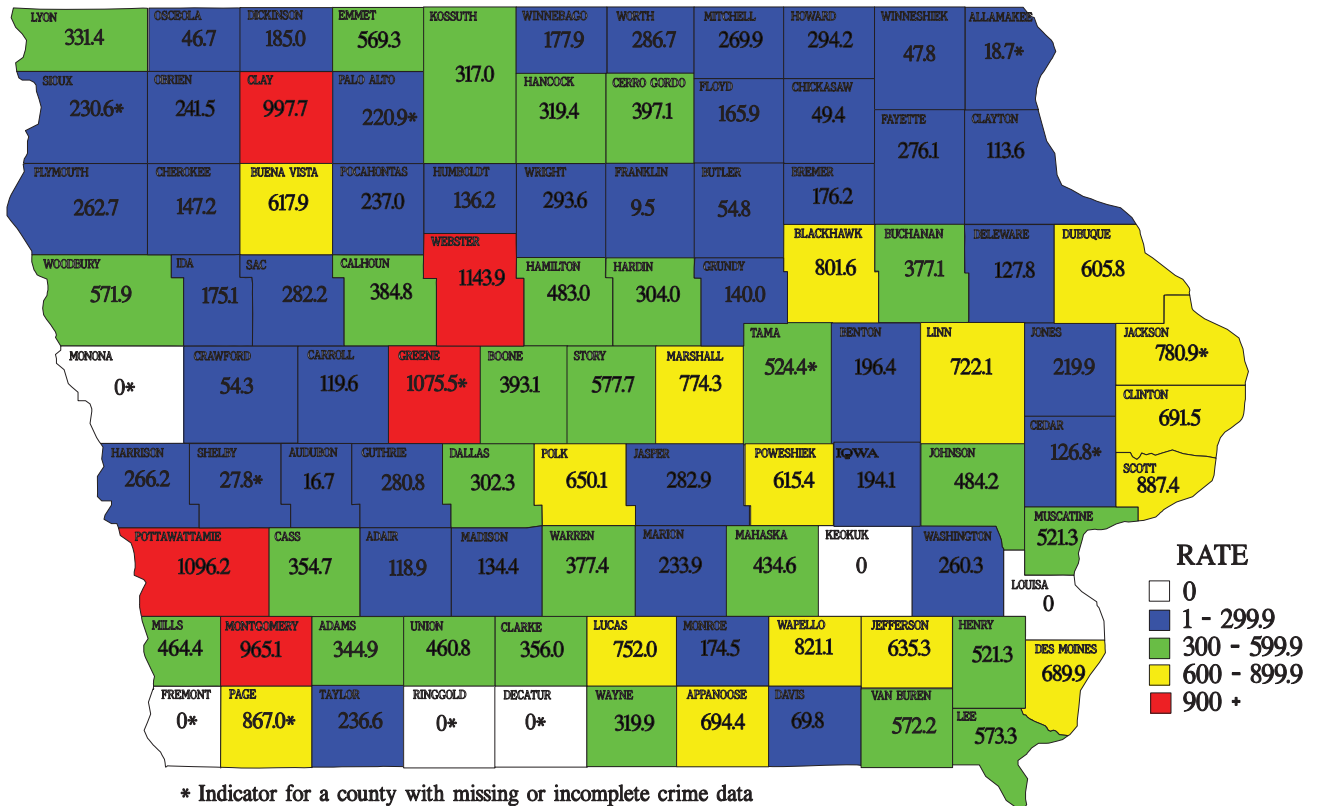

Residence or farm was the location most reported for the occurrence of a burglary in 2008, accounting for 65.8% followed by a parking lot/garage with 5.3%. Commercial/office buildings (4.5%), department or specialty stores (4.1%) and other/unknown (3.8%) were groupings that recorded the next highest number of offenses.
