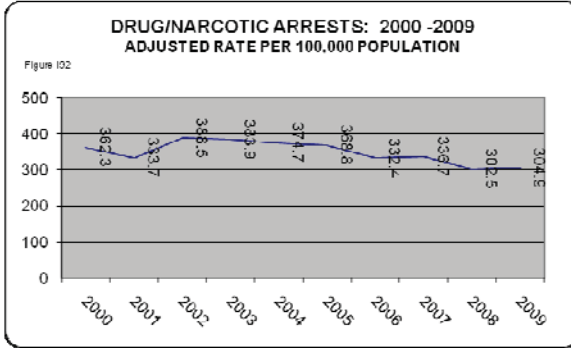
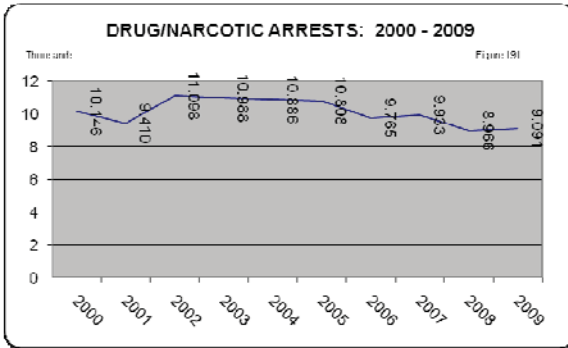


Over the last decade, reported drug/narcotic violations increased 22.3% between 1999 and 2005; but decreased for the three years following. There was very little change in the number of offenses and adjusted rate in 2009.

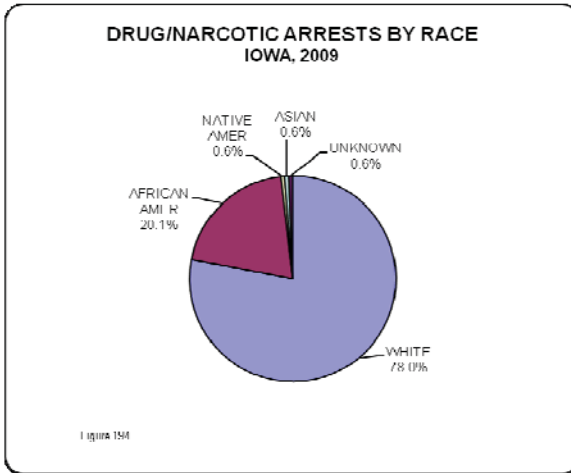
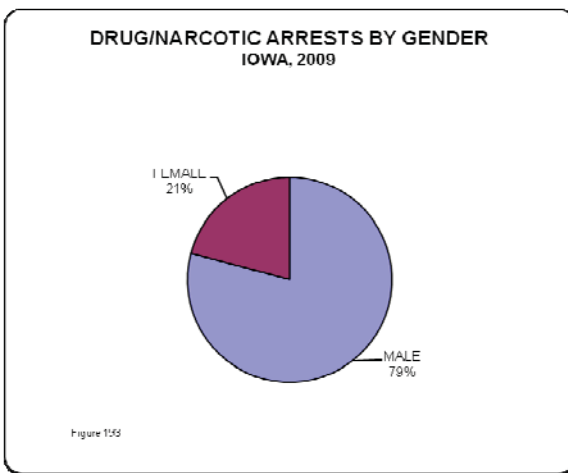

- Reported manufacture/distribute violations increased 1.9% from 2008. Specifically, meth/amphetamines increased 4.5%, marijuana/derivative increased 18.5%, and heroin increased 66.6%. However it is important to note that the percentage increase in heroin manufacturing/distributing seems high because of the relatively low numbers involved. The manufacturing/distributing of cocaine/crack decreased 28.4%.
- Reported possession/use violations increased less than 1% from 2008. Specifically, possession/use violations for meth/amphetamines increased 4.9% and marijuana increased 1.5%. Cocaine/crack possession/use violations decreased 25.6%.

ARRESTS



A decade high number of arrests and adjusted rate was recorded in 2002 with 11,098 arrests (388.5 per 100,000 population). Arrest rates decreased from 2002 to 2006, but have fluctuated since then. Arrest rates increased 0.8% in 2009.



- Overall, males (7,197) accounted for 79% of the drug offense arrests, while females (1,894) recorded 21% of the total.
- White offenders (7,093) accounted for 78.0% of the arrests, followed by African Americans (1,831) with 20.1%.
- White persons accounted for 93.4% of the meth/amphetamine arrests, 77.5% of the marijuana arrests, and 63.7% of the cocaine arrests. African American persons accounted for 73.1% of the crack arrests.

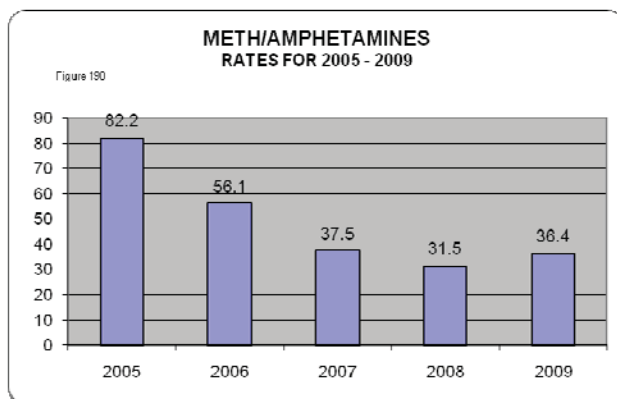
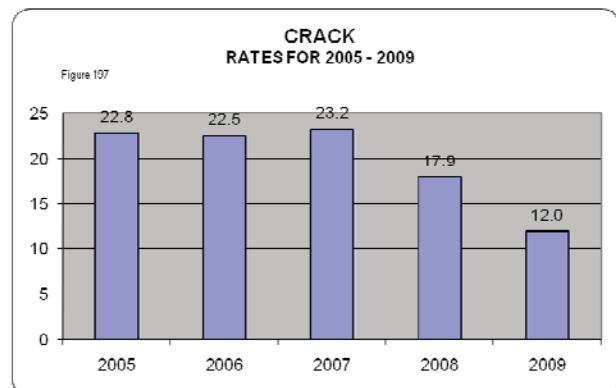
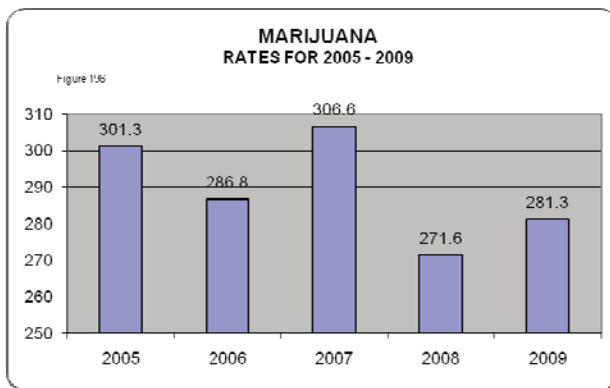
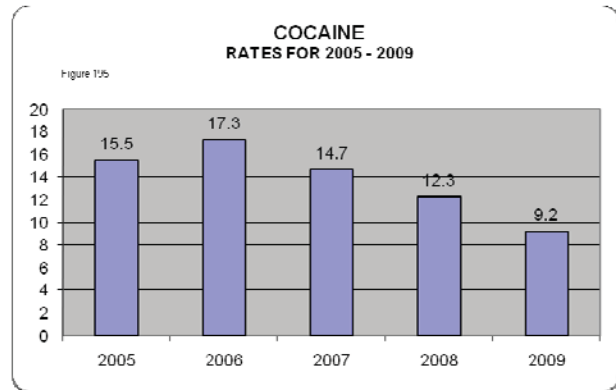

Caution: more than one drug type can be indicated in the incident/arrest:

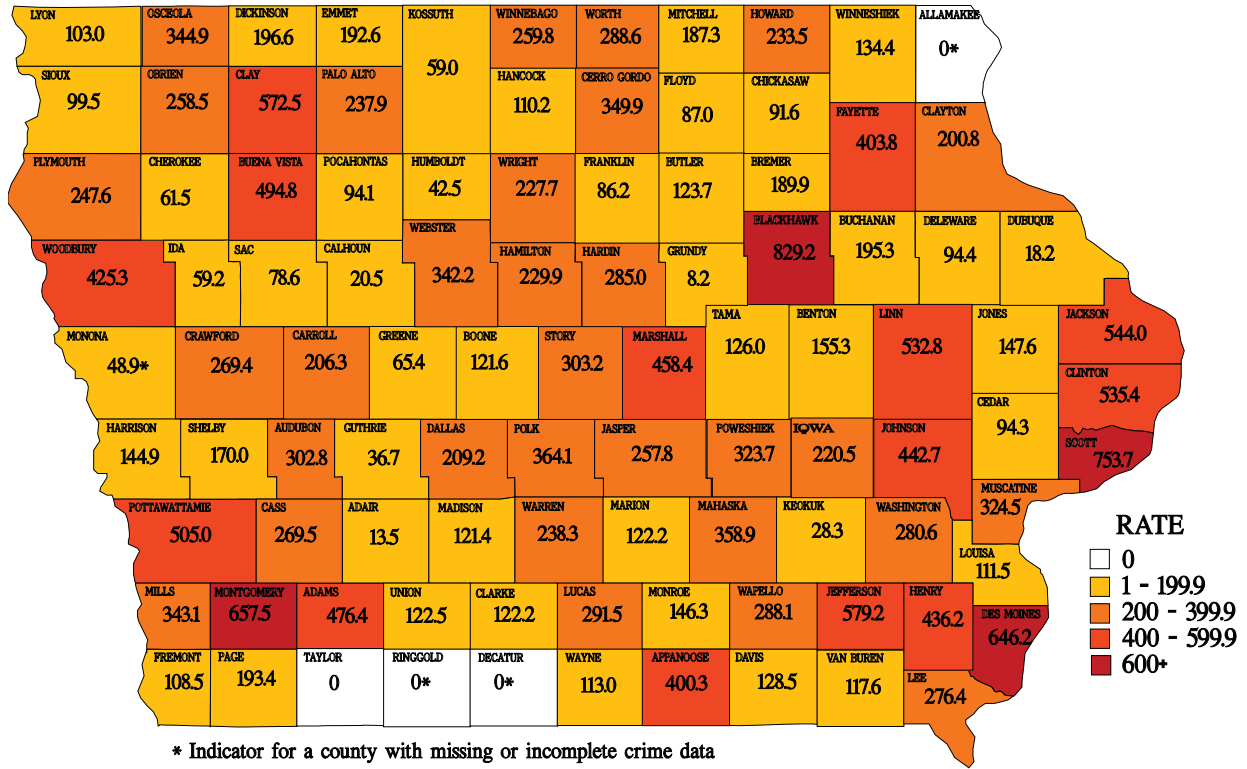
Rates for arrests are figured by using the estimated population from jurisdictions entering any arrests.

The graphs for cocaine and crack vary from those displayed in the 2007 UCR due to adjusted data.

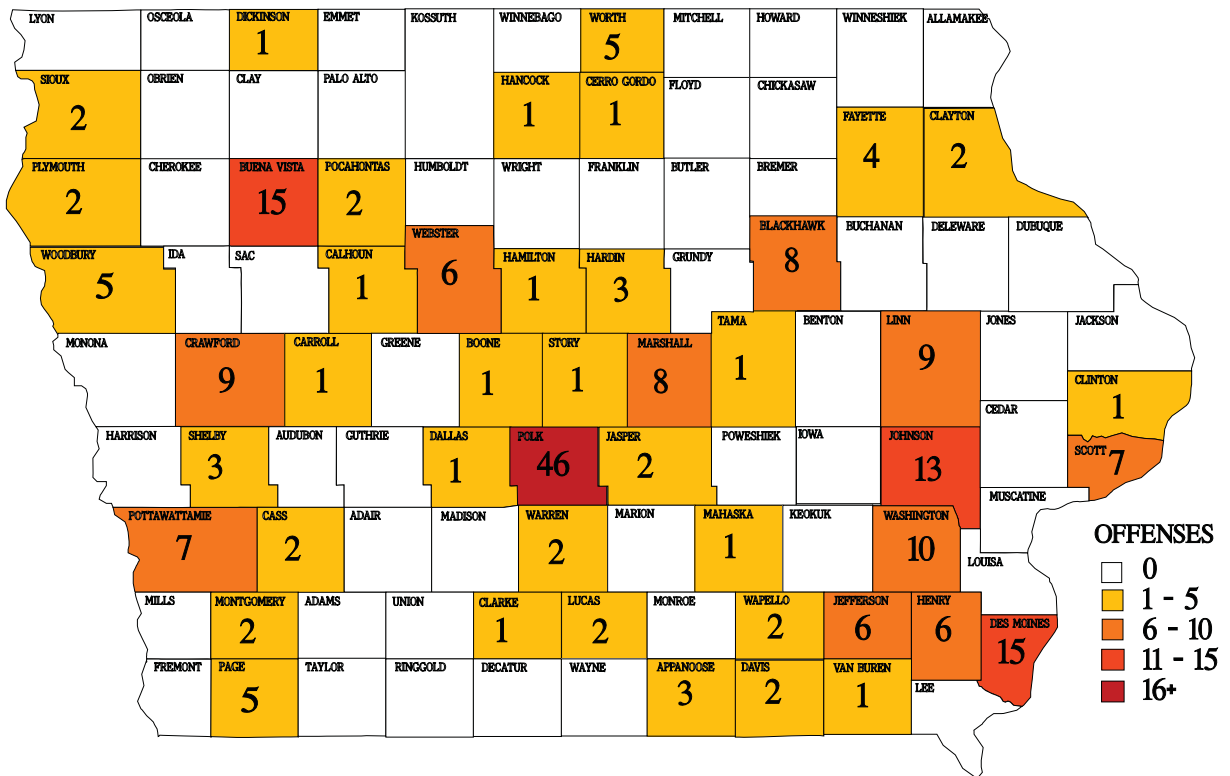


- Cocaine arrest rates increased 11.6% from 2005 to 2006, but have decreased 46.9% since 2006.
- Marijuana arrest rates have fluctuated over the last five years, but specifically increased 3.6% from 2008 to 2009.
- Crack arrest rates have decreased 48.3% since 2007, which was the high point for the five year period.
- Meth/amphetamine arrest rates decreased 61.7% from 2005 through 2008, but increased 15.6% in 2009.

2009 METH/AMPHETAMINE MANUFACTURE/DISTRIBUTE BY COUNTY

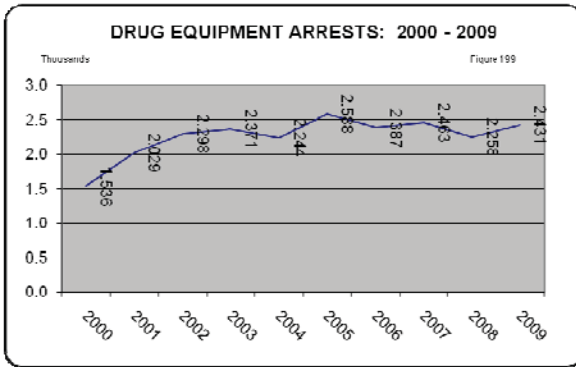

The number of drug equipment arrests increased 43% from 1999 to 2003 before decreasing 5% in 2004. In 2005, arrests reached a peak for the decade with 2,588 identified offenders. The number of arrests have fluctuated since then, but specifically increased 4.6% in 2009.

Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested for drug equipment violation were male (1,854 offenders). Only 577 females (24%) were arrested for the offense, which is comparable to the gender distribution in 2008.

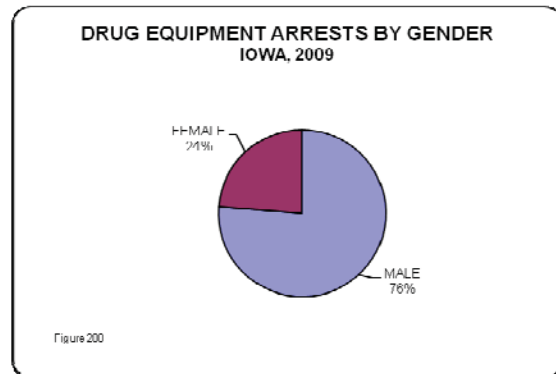
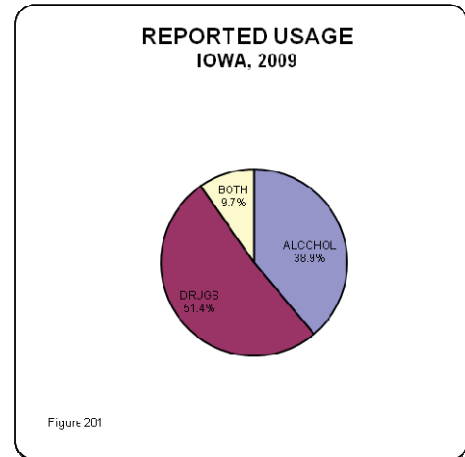

In 2009, White persons accounted for 88.1% of the reported arrestees. White adults recorded the highest number with 1,821 arrestees, followed by White juveniles (321) and African American adults (214).

- In 2009, there was an overall 2.0% increase in reported suspected offender use of drugs and/or alcohol. An increase of 0.8% was reported in suspected alcohol use while there was a 2.3% increase in reported drug use.

- The number of offenders using alcohol and/or drugs while involved in a homicide decreased from 14 reported in 2008 to 2 offenders in 2009.

- Drug/Narcotic Violations, Drug Equipment Violations, and Counterfeiting/Forgery were the only offenses where drugs were reported as being used more often than alcohol.

- Other than the Drug Violation categories, Simple Assault had the highest number of offenders listed as using drugs or alcohol.
