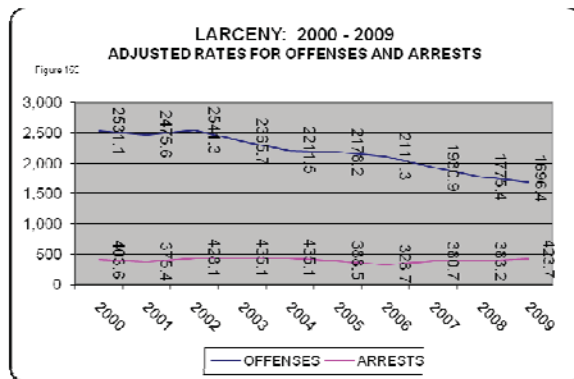
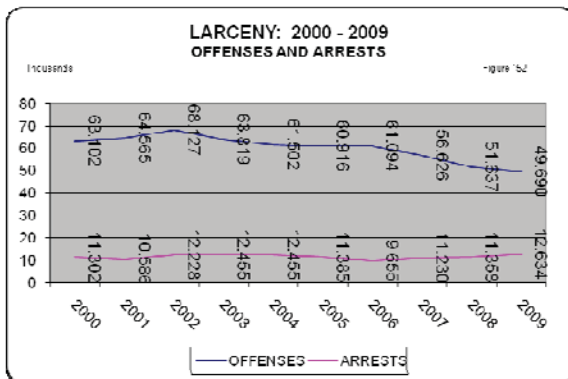

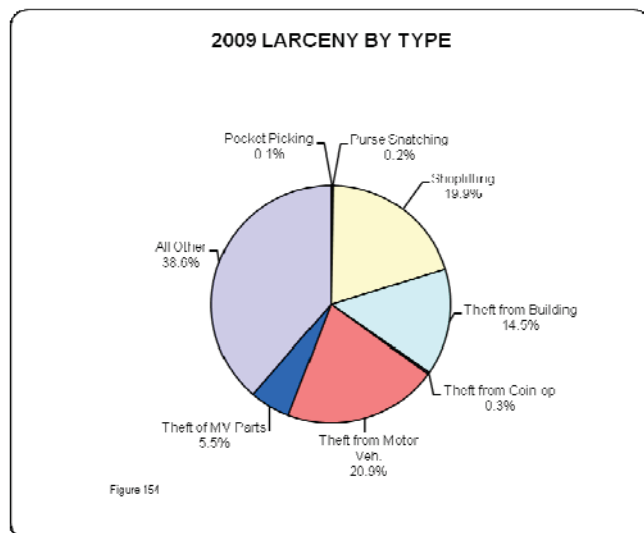


Larceny offenses recorded a decade high number of offenses and adjusted rate in 2002

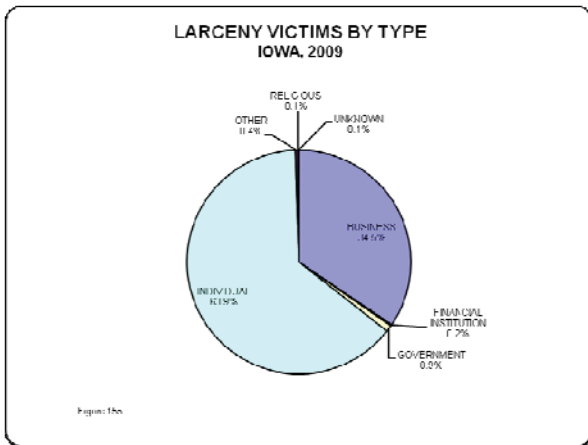
(68,127 or 2541.3 per 100,000 population). The adjusted rate has continued to decline since that time recording a decade low in 2009 (1696.4 per 100,000 population). In 2009, arrest rates increased 10.6% from 2008. The highest arrest rates were recorded in 2003 and 2004 (435.1 per 100,000 population). The decade’s lowest arrest rate was recorded in 2006 (328.7). Despite the offense rate decline, the arrest rate increased nearly one percent in 2008.

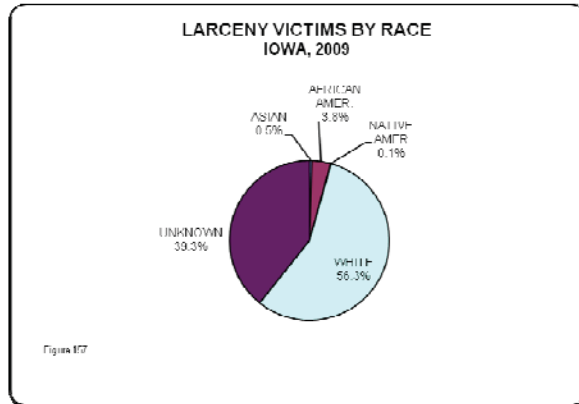
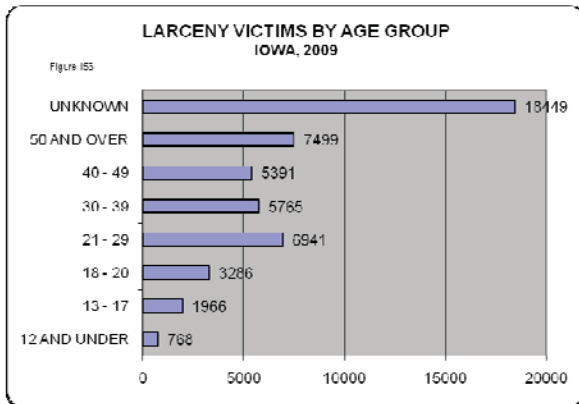
Larceny is broken down into eight classification types: Pocket Picking, Purse Snatching, Shoplifting, Theft from Building, Theft from Coin-Operated Machines, Theft from Motor Vehicle, Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories, and All Other Larceny. All Other Larceny (19,195 offenses) accounted for 38.6% of the documented larceny offenses. Theft from Motor Vehicle (20.9% or 10,394) and Shoplifting (19.9% or 9,889) were the next most reported larceny offenses.



VICTIMS



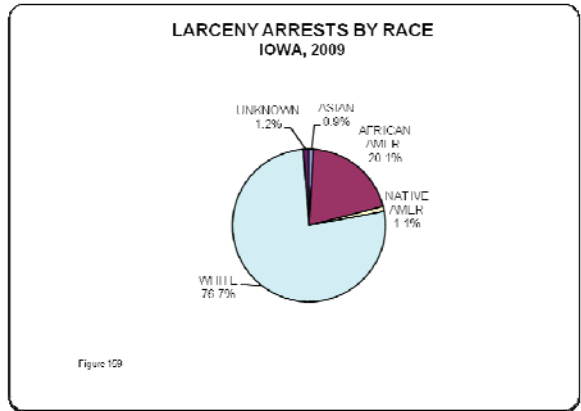
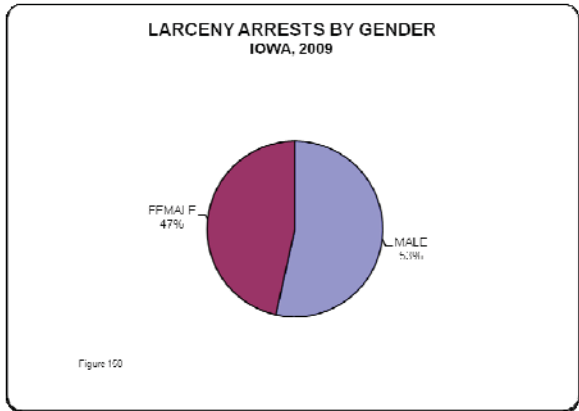
Individuals (31,975) accounted for 63.9% of the larceny victims in 2009, which is a slight increase from the 62.5% recorded in 2008. Among individuals 50.9% or 16,275 were male and 49.1% or 15,587 were female. Businesses (17,257) recorded 34.5% of the total victims. Government (469 victims), financial institutions (101 victims), and religious organizations (49 victims) also contributed to the total number of larceny victims. There were 215 victims listed as other or unknown.



In 2009, the age group 50 and over was reported most often (23.5% or 7,499 victims) among individual victims. Ninety-eight percent (17,876) of the unknown victims listed in Table 61 are comprised of businesses, financial institutions, religious organizations and government victims. White persons (56.3%) recorded the highest percentage of victims.

OFFENDERS



Males accounted for 53% (6,759 offenders) of the recorded arrests in 2009 while females recorded 47% (5,875 offenders). White males were the most arrested group of persons, accounting for 41% of the total arrests followed by White females with 36%.
